

- 3 giving a resident 2 different outfits to choose from demonstrates this right
- 5 residents are not expected to do this in return for the room & board; residents can CHOOSE to do this in order to keep busy or part of their therapy
- 6 unlawful restraint or restrictions of a person's right to freedom of movement
- 7 someone who supports & promotes the needs of others; employed by the state
- 8 care provided to maintain or restore health
- 9 residents have the right to expect that information about them will remain private; what is this called
- 10 residents have the right to voice concerns regarding their treatment or care; this demonstrates this right
- 12 separating a person from others against their will
- 13 failure to provide a person with goods or services needed to avoid harm; like walking past a resident's call light

DOWN

- 1 patient has the right to do this when they do not want a treatment
- 2 person who has the legal right to act on a resident's behalf when the resident can not
- 4 we must do this to all a resident's personal belongings to be sure we know who personal items belong to
- 6 saying or doing something to trick or fool a resident
- 11 willful inflication of injury, unreasonable confinement, intimidation or punishment that results in harm, pain or mental anguish
