Business Management

(12 Dual College Credit Hrs.)

- 1) Certificate of Completion - Global Supply Chain Management - requires 17 credits (SCM 100, 110, 120, 130 & 140 + 1 other approved 3 hr. course).
- 2) Certificate of Completion - Customer Service - requires 9 credits (BUS 110, 111 & MGMT 102 for total of 9 credits)

If students attend both sets of coursework, in either order, as Juniors and Seniors, they will have achieved a total of 23 dual college credit hours at JJC and receive TWO Certificates of Completion (if meeting dual credit requirements) in addition to the high school credit.

The mission of the Wilco Area Career Center is to develop skill sets that provide a pathway to college and career readiness.

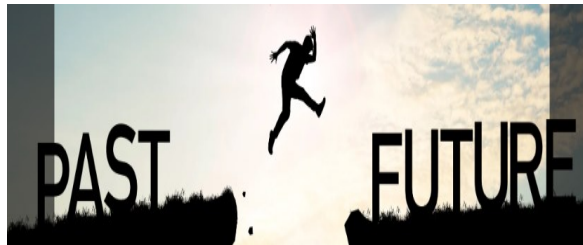
VISION

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What is Wilco?

The Wilco Area Career Center, located in Romeoville, Illinois, offers a facility where students take career-based courses, acquire training, and learn skills for life-long learning.

The Center provides junior and senior students the valuable opportunity to gain occupational skills and knowledge to enter into the workforce. Academic learning and technical training are taught through classroom instruction, hands-on activities, guest speakers and career-related events. The Center also develops business partnerships in the community to aid in preparing students for a global economy.

- Complete any prerequisites for the course
- Have a recommendation from the home school
